I walked the grounds after the meeting in the grueling heat. Due to the drought vegetation is really suffering. The grounds have gone to a "wild scape."



Flower Show Judges Symposium in Birmingham, Alabama

Regena Williams attended a Flower Show Judges Symposium in Birmingham, Alabama. She said that they studied Armature and Construction Designs which are considered advanced designs. (See examples on previous page.)

They also studied horticulture and the topics were Manipulated Plants, Collections and Displays, and Herbs.



A Collection is an exhibit of specimens judged for their cultural perfection. A minimum of five different specimens (cut or container-grown) exhibited in individual containers, or the appearance of being individually exhibited.

A Display is a collection of specimens exhibited with a strong overall artistic effect.
